Pet Waste

Has been dumped illegally in the storm sewer inlet, detention basin, drainage pathway, or along a creek bank.



This is a violation of City Ordinance relating to Chapter 405, section 245 Stormwater Quality Management and Illicit Discharge Control and 220.020 Nuisance Code.

Any person found to be in violation of the provisions of this section shall be subject to a penalty as set out in Section 100.010 of this Code. The judge hearing the violation may also order the removal or abatement of such nuisance and assess the costs of abatement to the person determined to be in violation.

When pet waste is left on the ground, it increases the risk of it washing into our storm water system.

This can increase the level of bacteria in the water that can harm wildlife and make the water unsafe for swimming, fishing and boating.

What should you do with it?

- ✓ Pick up after your pet
- ✓ Dispose of it into a trash can or down the toilet

What should you not do?

- ✓ Leave it lay on the ground
- ✓ Hose it down the storm sewer
- ✓ Bag it, then dispose of it down the storm sewer inlet
